So in this context, I believe it is important that the organisation is seen to be involved in the tender process to secure funding to support and assist what is important to all of us involved in school food.

Due to the commercial sensitivity that surrounds any procurement process, I am not in a position to provide specific details of LACA's involvement in the bidding process until the next newsletter.

However, I can say that LACA is involved in what I think is a strong bid and want to reassure LACA members that "we're in the frame!!"

## SCHOOL FOOD PLAN
